THE JOHN LOUDEN MEMORIAL

Following the tragic death of WO1 John Louden and his family, a golf trophy was purchased by the Warrant Officers' and Sergeants' Mess, 1st Battalion the Royal Scots (The Royal Regiment) to be competed annually in his memory. John Louden was a keen golfer and due to his association with golf it was only fitting that he should be remembered through the sport.

WO1 (RSM) John Louden was serving as RSM of Tayforth UOTC when he died along with his wife and young son in a car accident on the A9, South of Auchterarder in April 1979, it had previously been published that John would be returning to assume The Regimental Sergeant Major's post with the Battalion, then The 1st Battalion The Royal Scots (The Royal Regiment) and now The Royal Scots Borderers, 1st Battalion, The Royal Regiment of Scotland (1 Scots), from WO1 (RSM) John Sands.

The event is regarded in an equivalent manner to the Burns Night by members of the Warrant Officer's and Sergeants' Mess and its popularity is observed by both serving and past members, who return to compete on the day. The day is to commemorate the memory of John Louden and his family, and it should be full of humour and enjoyed by all attending.

RULES

The day is 18 hole stroke play, for the winner receiving the John Louden Trophy, The Best Gross score is also contested; the winner of the Best Gross score receives the Larry Gilbert Trophy. Both Trophies can only be won by Ex SNCOs and LE Officers who served in the Royal Scots and 1 SCOTS. The John Louden and Larry Gilbert Trophy cannot be won by the same individual if this situation arises the winner chooses the title he wishes to receive the second place individual for the respective trophy claims the alternative prize.

The Guest of honour will initiate the competition by attacking the first ball with the remainder of the mess evaluating his swing.

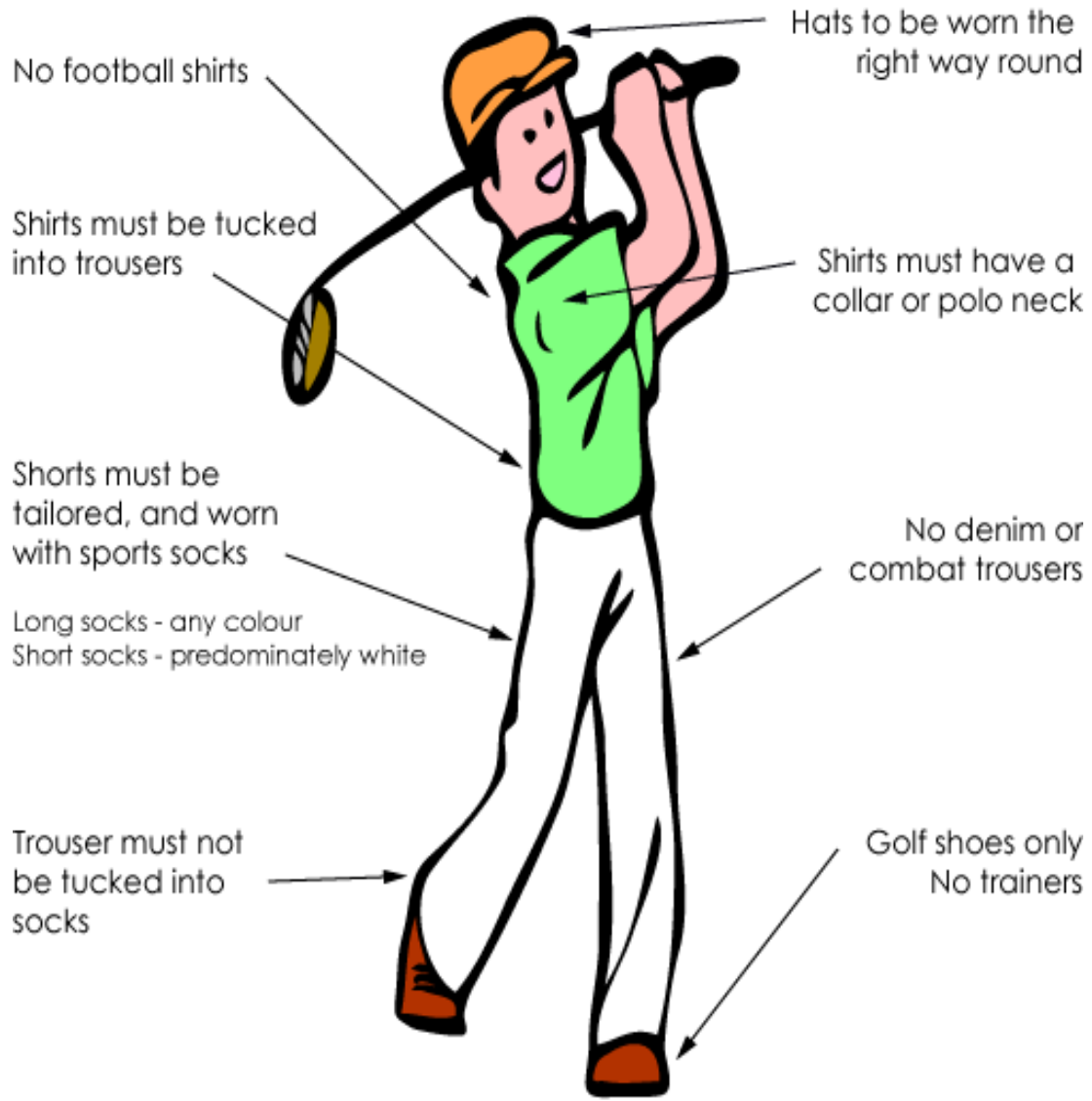

Golf Rules

Speed of play – the acceptable standard is 4 hours for a four ball game please keep pace

Always be ready to play your shot

Mark your scorecard on the next hole

Stableford Morning Round



Scoring system:

- On a Par 3 you take 5 shots please pick your Ball up and move to the next hole
- On a Par 4 you take 6 shots please pick your Ball up and move to the next hole
- On a Par 5 you take 7 shots please pick your Ball up and move to the next hole

Stroke Play Afternoon Round

Every shot counts

If you think you have lost your ball play a provisional

You are allowed 5 mins to find your ball

If you have lost your ball from a tee shot your next shot will be your 3rd shot if you lose that then you will take an extra 2 shot penalty till your ball is in play

Replace divots, repair ball marks on the green (not just your own) and rake the bunker after playing your shot. The rack is placed inside the bunker.
